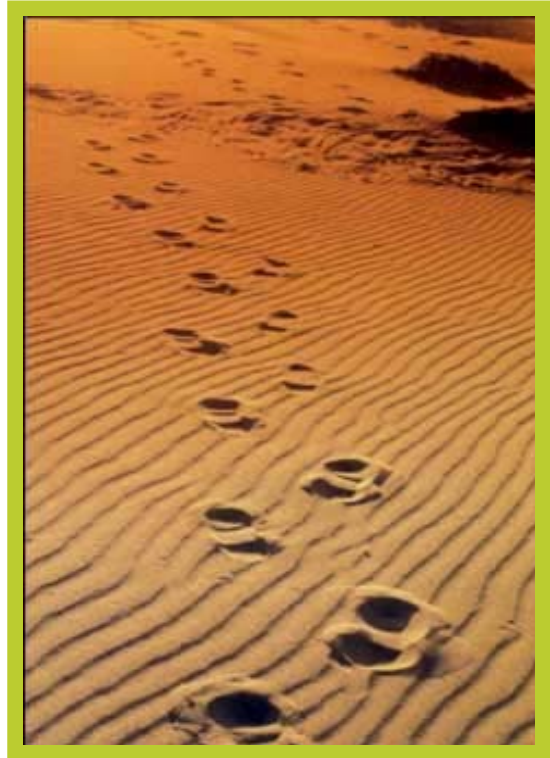

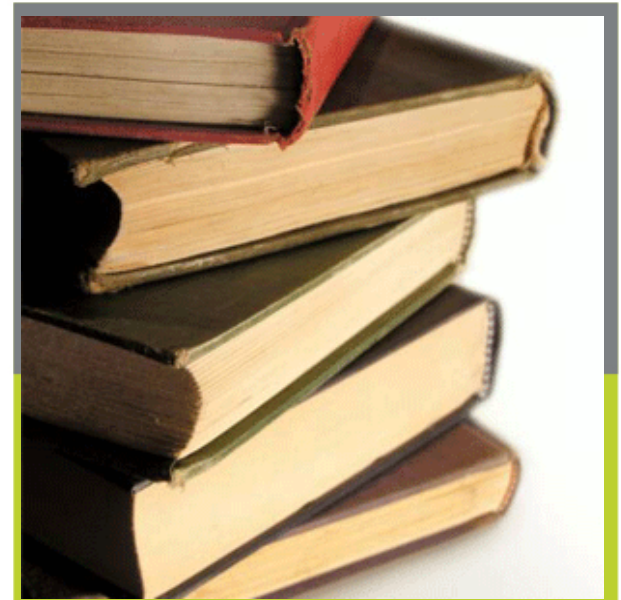
6. THE BLESSING: THE STORY OF GOD'S MISSION IN THE BIBLE [204]
